### SUNDAY 7 FEBRUARY 2021 – FIFTH SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME

#### GOSPEL: MARK 1:29-39 The healing ministry of Jesus

In 'Ordinary Time' of the liturgical year, the Sunday Gospels focus our attention on the public ministry of Jesus. A focal point of Jesus' ministry was the healing of the sick. The Church celebrates World Day of Prayer for the Sick each year on 11 February, which is the Feast Day of Our Lady of Lourdes (Thursday of this week). Pope Francis, in his Message for World Day of the Sick, states that a society is truly human when it cares effectively for the sick and suffering in a spirit of communal love, emphasising that we must strive to make sure "no-one will feel alone, excluded or abandoned". Prayer was, of course, central to Jesus's ministry – Scripture tells us that He sometimes prayed alone and sometimes prayed with others. As a parish community, for the most part, we are confined to praying in our own homes at this time, rather than joining together in our churches for prayer. We are, nonetheless, very much united in prayer this week, for the sick, in our *Novena*: with trust in God's will, we pray, through the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes, for the healing hand of Jesus to bring consolation to all who suffer from any form of sickness.

### **Day 6 - Monday 8 February:**

For all who struggle with addiction

### **Day 7 - Tuesday 9 February:**

For all in the caring profession - doctors, nurses, paramedics and ambulance staff, care assistants, other support workers in our hospitals and care homes, all who care for sick family members at home

### **Day 8 - Wednesday 10 February: Rosary & Novena Prayer at 7.30pm:**

For all who suffer from poor mental health and those who are worried about their own mental health or that of a loved one at this time

### **Day 9 - Thurs 11 February:**

For sick children, especially those who suffer long term illnesses, their parents and all who care for them

### **NOVENA PRAYER**

**Loving Mother Mary, you declared yourself at Lourdes as the Immaculate Conception.**

**Help me to imitate your example of trust**

**and always say Yes to the will of God, especially in times of difficulty.**

**Through your loving intercession,**

**I come before you today with my prayer request.....**

*(Pause for silent prayer).*

**I ask you to bring it before your Son, Jesus, our merciful Lord and Saviour.**

**In return, help me to bear witness to the message of His holy Word each day,  
by the example of my life.**

***Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us. St Bernadette, pray for us.***

## ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

This is the version that we recite during each of our Masses –  
you are encouraged to pray it and to teach it to children.

**My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.**

**I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul.**

**Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally,  
come at least spiritually into my heart.**

**I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.**

**Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.**

**LENT** begins on Wednesday of *next* week, 17 February. I will celebrate Mass on that day but, unfortunately, we will not be able to have the distribution of Ashes this year. This is a diocesan-wide decision, taken in the interests of everyone's safety and in keeping with the current restrictions. Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence.

The three traditional pillars of Lenten observance are: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. The main focus of our almsgiving during Lent is the Trócaire Lenten Campaign. Trócaire was established in 1973 as the overseas development agency of the Catholic Church in Ireland. Despite all the difficulties we encountered in our lives in 2020, the people of Ireland remained united in their solidarity with people facing poverty and injustice, responding generously, as always, to the Lenten Campaign. The focus of this year's Campaign is South Sudan: resources will be available in the weeks of Lent giving up to date information on the work of Trócaire and, in particular, its 2021 projects. Trócaire remains conscious of the focus that the Trócaire Box in our homes during Lent draws to the need for our support in helping to alleviate the plight of those desperately in need. So, despite the churches being closed at this time, Trócaire Boxes will be distributed to our churches in the coming days, where they can be picked up at your convenience.
