GOSPEL: MARK 1:14-20 - 'At once they left their nets and followed Him'

'Follow me and I will make you into fishers of men' – Jesus' invitation to the four fishermen, is open to all of us. SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

Today, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, we celebrate Sunday of the Word of God. In 2019, Pope Francis declared the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time each year as Sunday of the Word of God. In declaring this annual celebration, Pope Francis said, *"We need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord...The Bible belongs above all to those called to hear its message and to recognise themselves in its words...The Word of God unites believers and makes them one people."* Pope Francis invites us never to take God's Word for granted but, instead, to *"let ourselves be nourished by it, in order to acknowledge and live fully our relationship with Him and with our brothers and sisters"*.

Pope Francis invites us, therefore, to get to know Christ through deepening our understanding and knowledge of the Bible. Familiarising ourselves with the Word of God before we hear it at Sunday Mass is a good way of gaining a better understanding of what God is saying to us in the Scriptures and you may therefore wish to consider devoting some sacred time and space each week to taking a look through the Readings each week this coming year, in advance of Sunday Mass. Each week in the newsletter, I give the reference for the Gospel reading for the following Sunday, so that you can check it out, either in your bible or on www.catholicbishops.ie.

Remember, in the words of Pope Francis: *"The Bible is not just a beautiful book to keep on a shelf. It is the Word of life to be sown, a gift that the Risen Jesus asks us to accept in order to have life in His name"*.

SUNDAY SCRIPTURES: Next Sunday, 31 January, is the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel we will listen to is St Mark 1:21-28: 'He taught them with authority'. You can access the Readings on: www.catholicbishops.ie/readings - or in your bible!

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK - 24-31 JANUARY: The theme this year is *Catholic Schools: Communities of Faith and Resilience*. There is no doubt whatsoever that our school communities - staff, children and parents - have had to be resilient in the incredible challenges they have had to face in the last year, with no immediate let-up in sight.

The normal activities associated with Catholic Schools Week are not feasible this year, but I will celebrate the **10.00am Mass on Friday of this week, 29 January**, for the intentions of everyone who is part of the St Patrick's PS community - the children, the teachers, ancillary staff, and the parents, grandparents and family members who have supported the children in so many ways during the Covid pandemic, and continue to do so. I ask you to join me on the parish webcam for this Mass. In particular, I ask that parents make special effort for their children to participate in this Mass.

NOVENA TO OUR LADY OF LOURDES: I invite you to join with me in praying a Novena to Our Lady of Lourdes, starting on 3 February, for the Sick. The Novena will finish on 11 February, which is Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and is World Day of Prayer for the Sick.

A Novena Prayer will be published in our parish newsletter next week and also on our parish Facebook page. It will be prayed each time I celebrate Mass - you can participate online, and/or you can pray it in your home, perhaps with family members or, if it suits you, you can come along to the church to pray it at a time that suits you. Each day, we will have a different prayer intention, which will be published. .

We all know people who are sick at this time and I ask, in particular, that you bring this Novena of Prayer for the Sick to the attention of anyone you may know who is suffering from any form of sickness, to give them the opportunity to participate in these special days of prayer in our parish.
